MA In Psychoanalytic Studies.

What is the MA in Psychoanalytic studies?

The MA in Psychoanalytic Studies is an online distance learning programme which seeks to provide students with a thorough understanding of psychoanalysis and its applications in social theory, the arts and cultural analyses.

Who is the course for?

This programme is designed for those with a general interest in psychoanalysis and its application to a range of disciplines, such as literary criticism, cultural studies and sociology. It is also appropriate for counsellors, psychotherapists, and other mental health practitioners to further their professional development by learning more about psychoanalytic theory and its intellectual and conceptual context.

Our students currently include psychologists, film-makers, therapists, analysts-in-training, lawyers, and teachers.

What units are on offer?

The full Masters programme consists of taught units and a dissertation. All students must take the core units, Foundations in Psychoanalysis I & II, then can choose from a range of options, including Psychoanalysis & the Arts and Psychodynamics of Social Processes. Students may also choose to take some units from our affiliated MSc in Psychotherapy Studies, which includes units on Conflict Management & Reconciliation, Well-Being & Health.

Online learning
