
Ethics approval at ScHARR

The student, with input from the supervisor, is responsible for deciding **whether ethics approval is required** and **which ethics review procedure is applicable**. Students carrying out research overseas should check what ethics permissions are required in the country. Use flowchart b. if approval has already been obtained from another institution, or flowchart a. otherwise.


I. Determining whether ethics approval is required and the different routes

a. Where no approval has been obtained from other institutions

Does your research include human participants, personal data or human tissue? (This could include any activities: anonymous online questionnaire, social media data, to face-to-face interviews to a clinical trial)

These examples are provided to help students understand the type of information, and the level of detail, that is required in the answers to the ethics application form's questions. Please note that they are NOT intended to be used to simply copy and paste text into student's own applications. Students must be encouraged to reflect on the ethical issues presented by their own projects and to provide appropriate answers specific to their project and circumstances.

6. There are guidance notes on the online system. Please ensure that there are adequate details in the application form. It is not acceptable to ask ethics reviewers to refer to protocol and other documentation, instead a summary should be presented.
