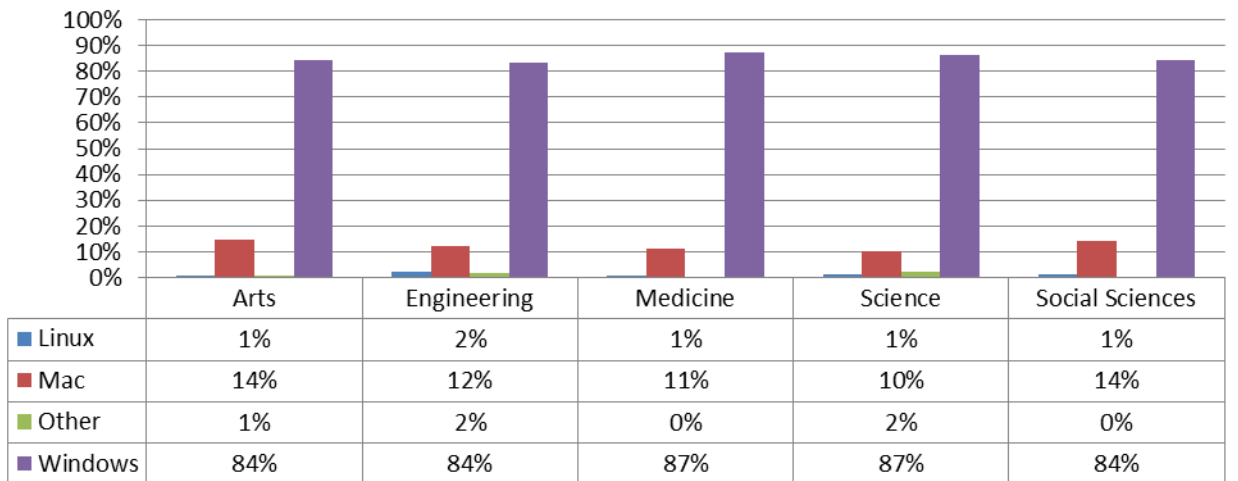


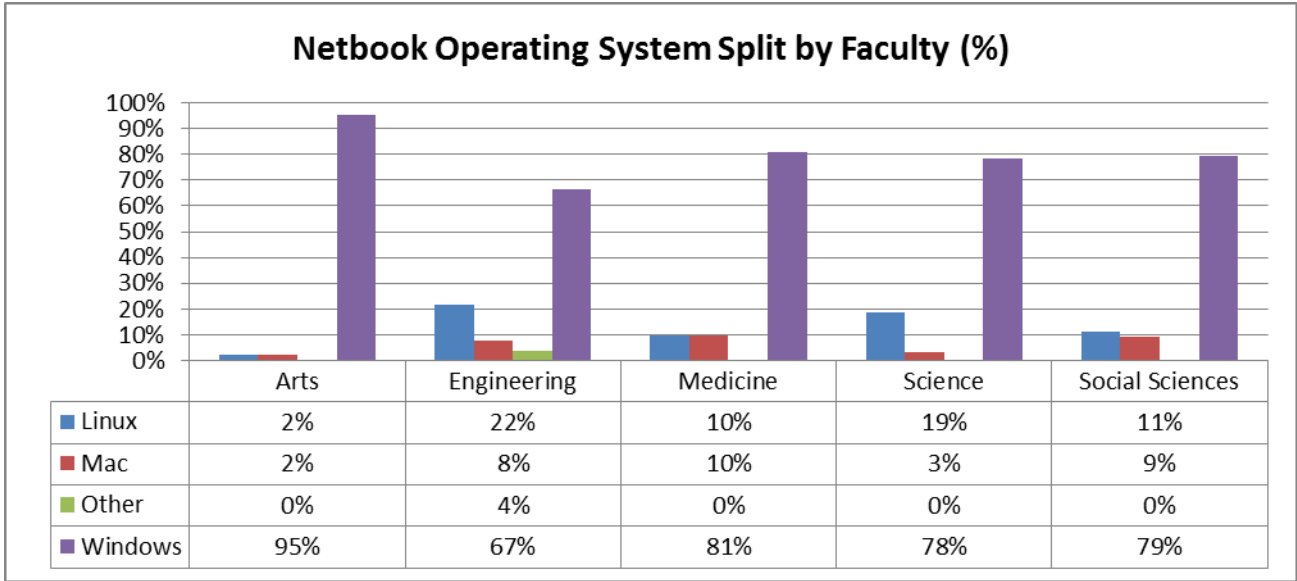
Smartphone ownership Split by Faculty (%)



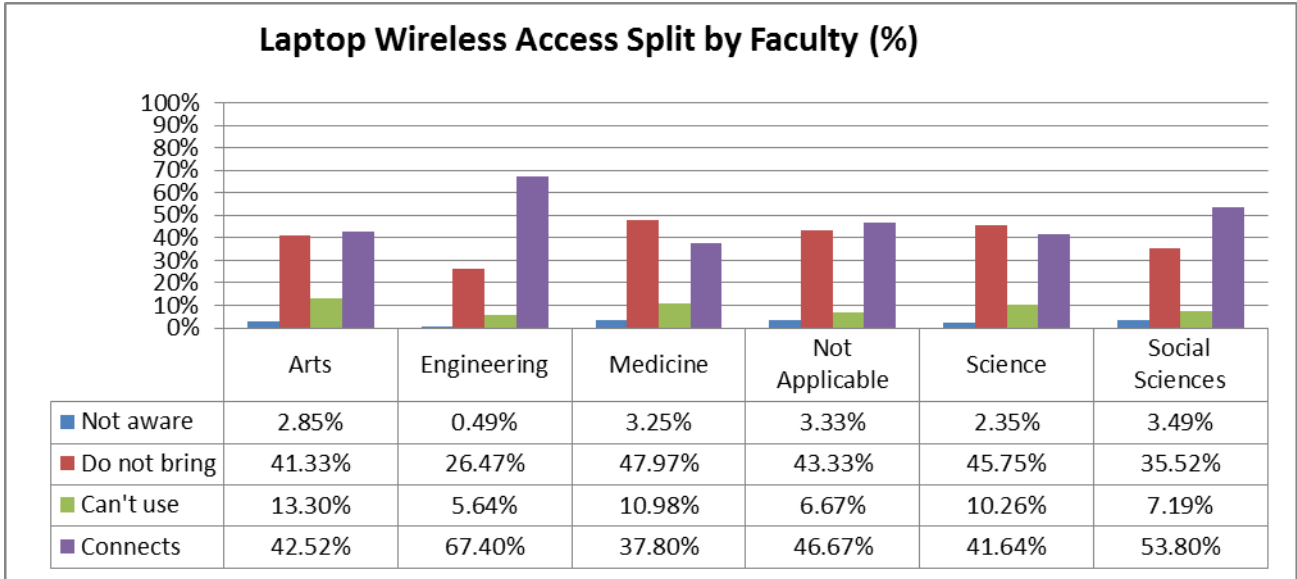

Laptop Operating System Split by Faculty (%)

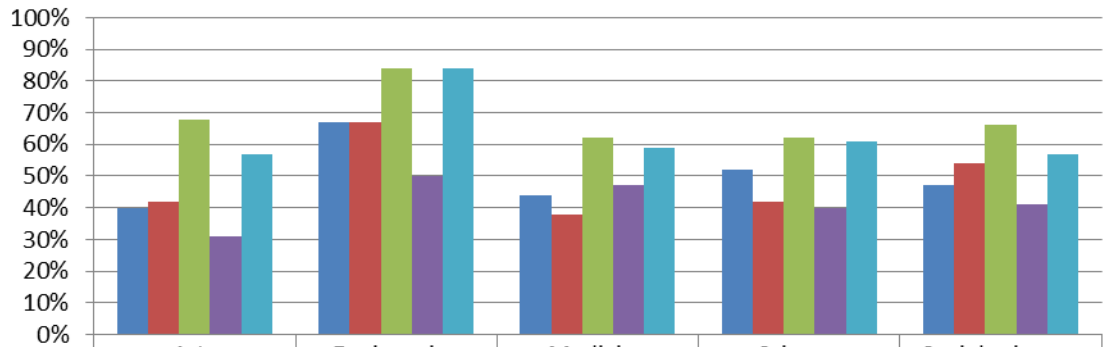
