Incoming Study Abroad students normally take level 100 and level 200 modules, i.e. courses beginning MGT1 and MGT2. All students must meet the pre-requisites before choosing a module, and in some cases modules may be restricted due to class size. Students taking 20 credit modules at level 100 must be in Sheffield for both the Autumn and Spring semester (in that order).

In some cases incoming Study Abroad students can take level 300 modules. However, they must clearly meet the pre-requisites of the courses in order to do so.

Exchange students are not permitted to take postgraduate modules, i.e. courses beginning MGT6.
