ICOSS... Home of the Social Sciences

The Interdisciplinary Centre of the Social Sciences (ICOSS) is a large scale dedicated facility for social science research.

ICOSS builds on the international reputation of the University of Sheffield to bring together thirteen schools and departments across the Social Sciences into a unique interdisciplinary forum for research and innovation.

Our objective is to foster creative dialogue between the constituent departments in order to undertake high quality interdisciplinary research that can inform social policy and critical thinking in the social sciences.

We also aim to foster productive collaboration with colleagues beyond the Social Sciences including Health, Engineering and Environmental Science.

About ICOSS

ICOSS, the Interdisciplinary Centre of the Social Sciences, is a £5.7M initiative funded by the Science Research Infrastructure Fund (SRIF) together with a substantial investment by the University of Sheffield, which promotes and supports evidence-based interdisciplinary research to inform social policy and critical thinking at regional, national and International levels.

The five storey purpose-built facility, with state-of-the-art ICT infrastructure and resources, opened in November 2004 and accommodates up to 100 researchers.



The Meeting Rooms

ICOSS is equipped with state-of-the-art corporate meeting and conferencing facilities. We have four "corporate" rooms available for booking.

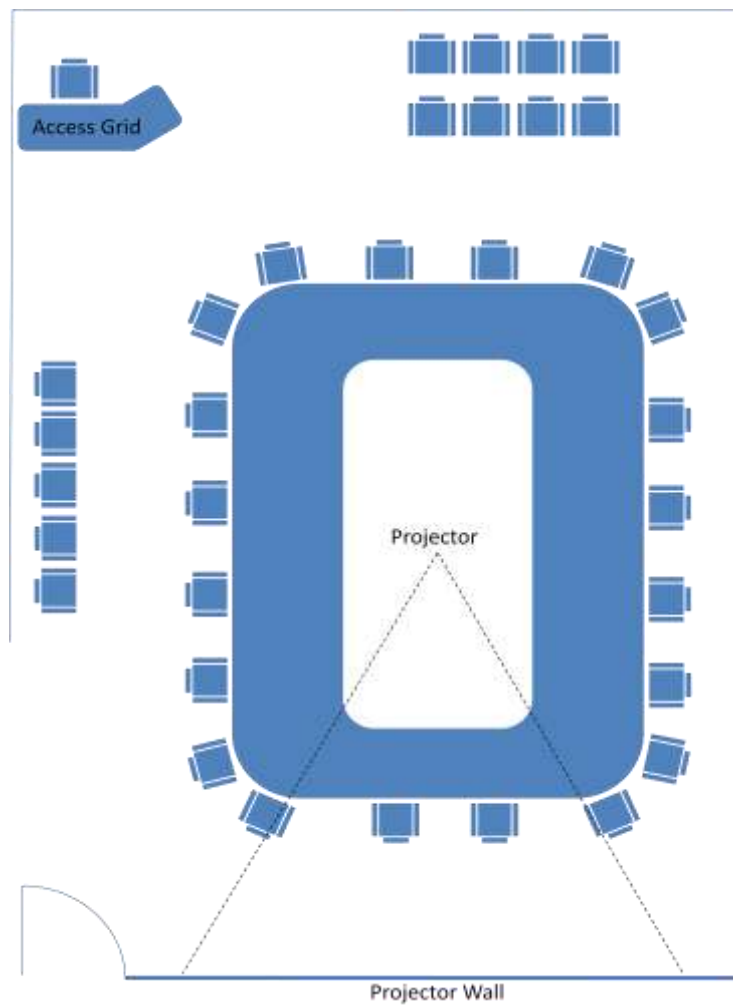
All rooms have the following:

Boardroom

The ICOS Boardroom offers a round-table meeting space, with capacity for 32 people.

The Boardroom also features ICOS's Access Grid Node, which allows advanced video-conferencing with colleagues in other UK institutions or partners throughout the world.



Conference Room

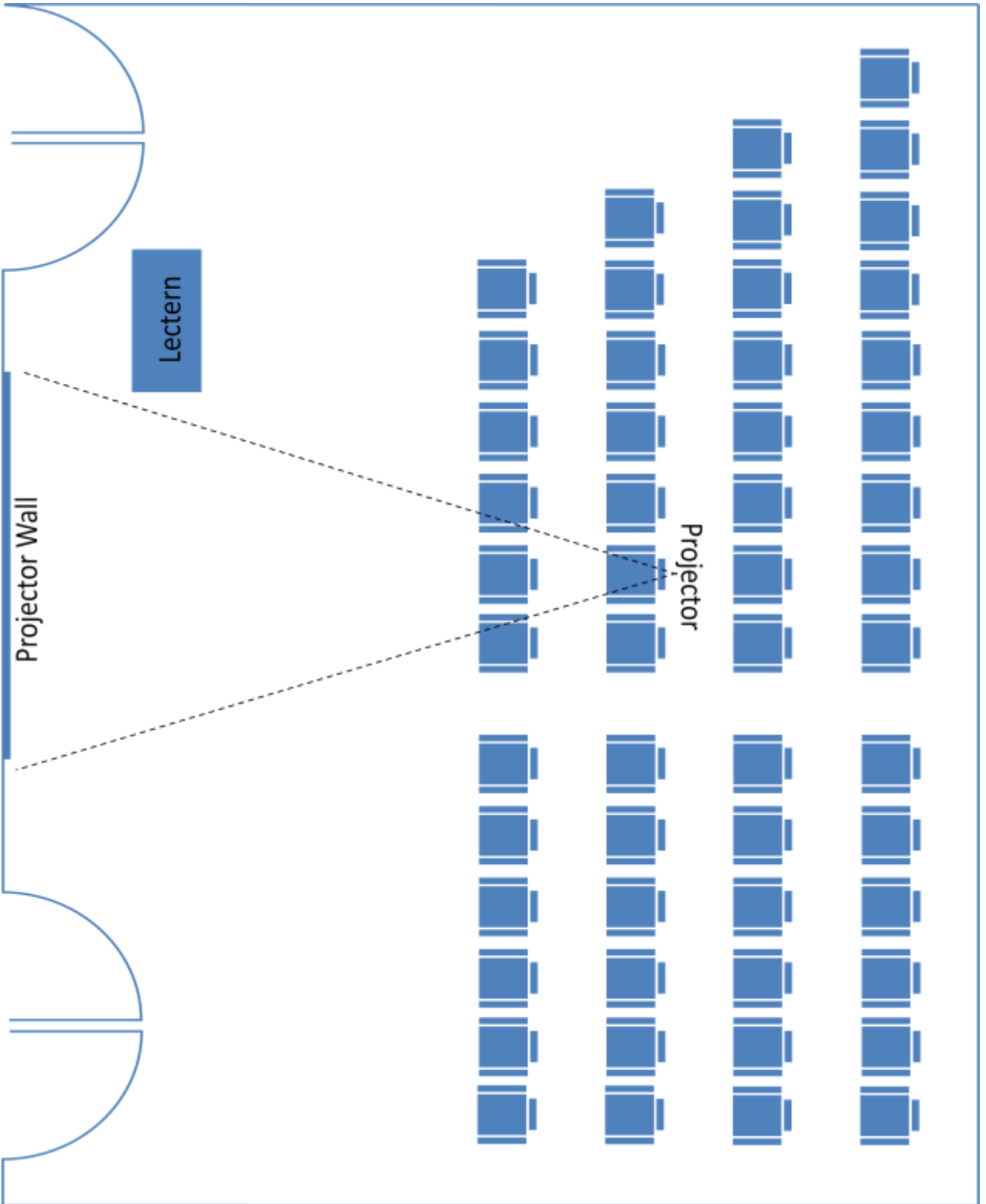


This room is located inside the ICOS building's distinctive and prominent 'Pod'.

The Conference Room offers a lecture or conference style arrangement of furniture, though some other layouts can be catered for with the addition of tables. This room also houses a traditional video-conferencing system.



The maximum capacity of the Conference Room is 60 people.

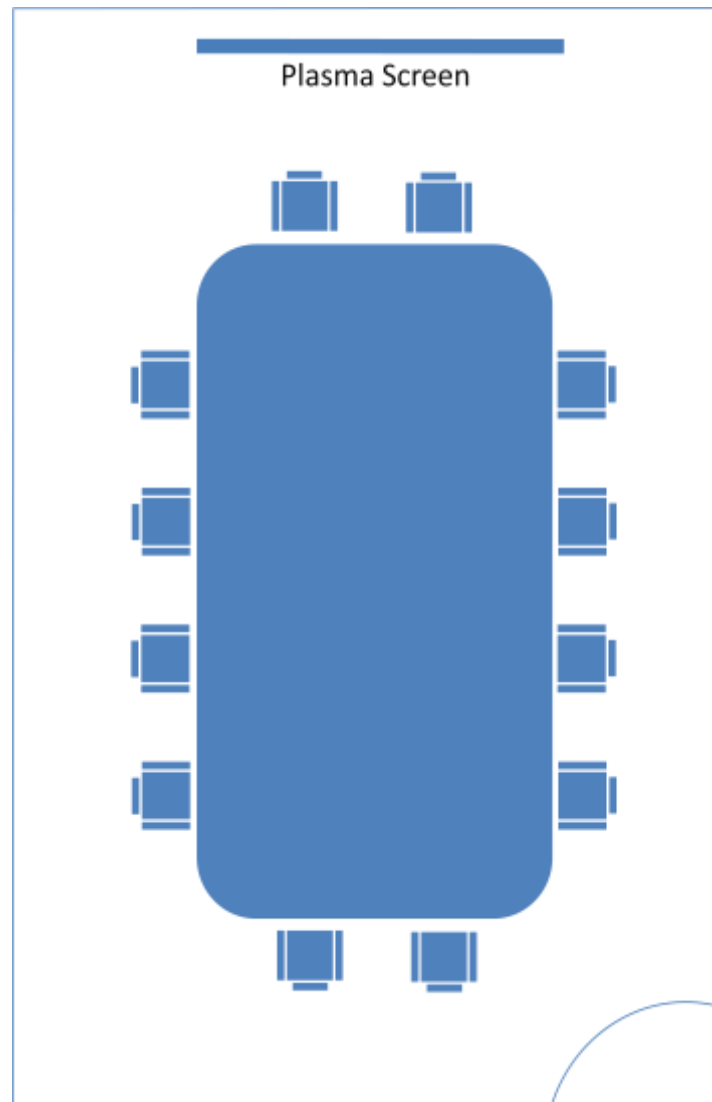


Glass Meeting Room

The smaller of ICOSS's meeting spaces, the Glass Meeting Room,

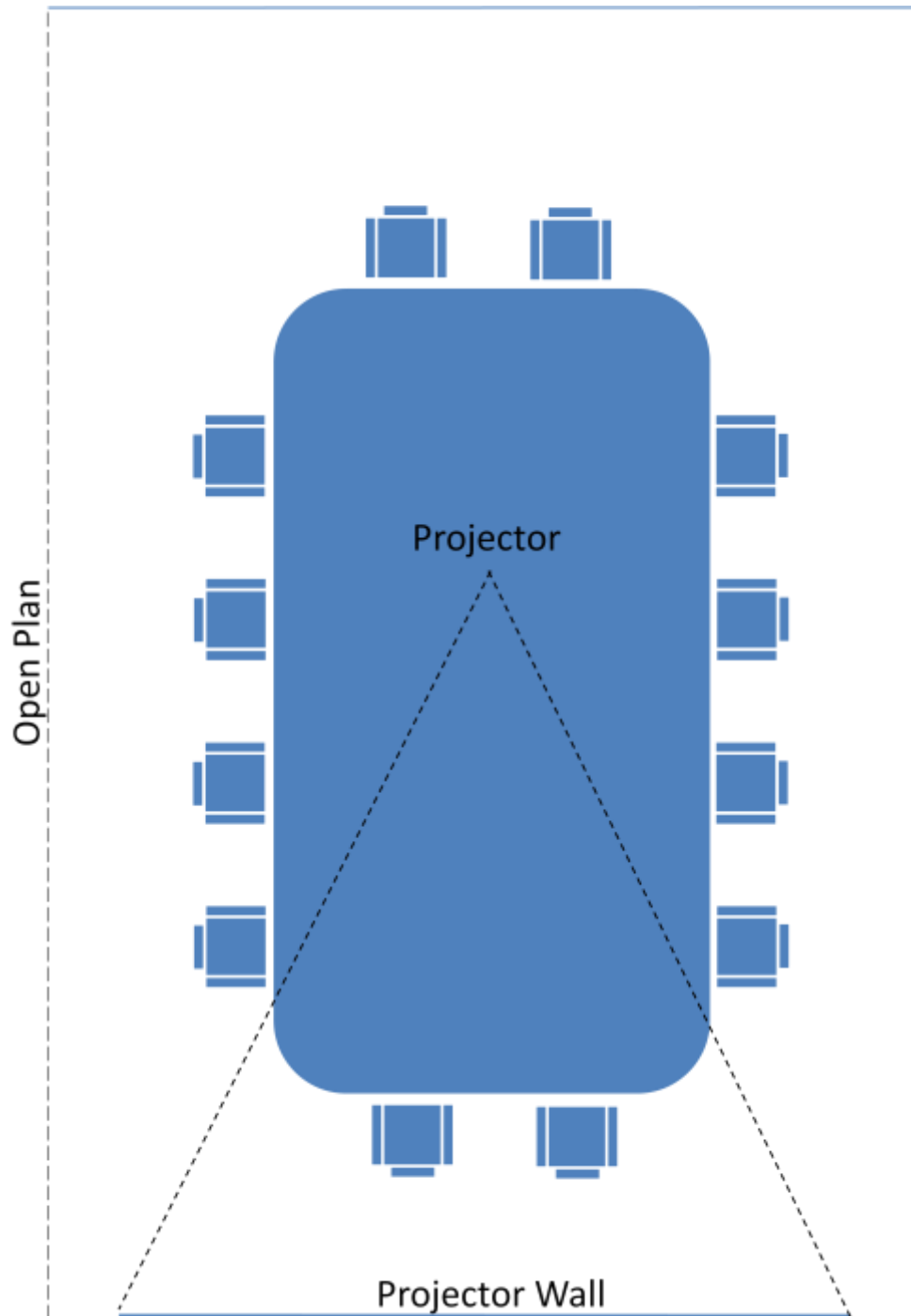
can accommodate up to 14 guests.

This space is located on the first floor and is open plan. It is ideal for a break-out space and for catering.



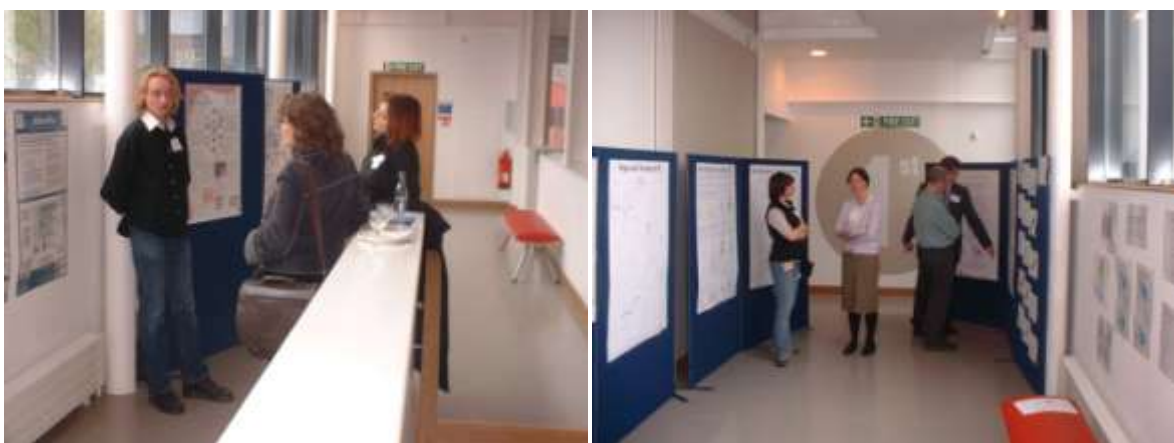
Foyer

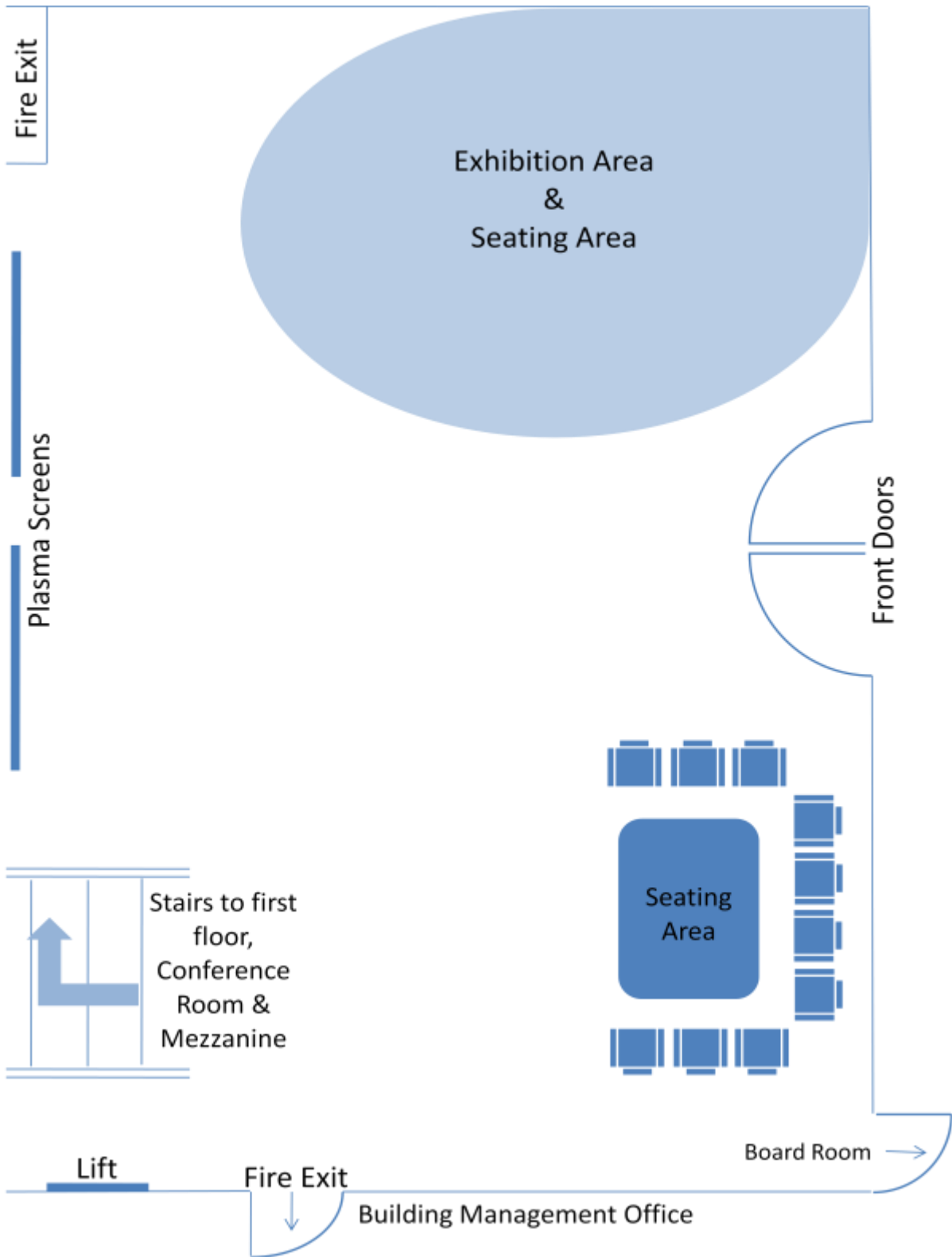
ICOSS's large entrance Foyer is the ideal location for receiving visitors to events, Exhibitions, presentations and for guests to take coffee and lunch breaks.

Location



Getting here

SupertramTrams link the railway station and the city centre directly to the University. Trams from the station to the University run on the Blue route (destination "Malin Bridge").

Trams from the city centre to the University run on both the Blue route and the Yellow route (destination "Middlewood").

During the day, trams run every 10 minutes (15 minutes on Sundays) from 6.00am to midnight.

Buses to the University are frequent and inexpensive. From the railway station and coach station you can take the number 40 directly to the University. Other buses from the city centre include the 51 and 52.

Park and Ride is the easiest way for car drivers to travel to the University. There are Supertram Park and Ride sites at Nunnery Square (off the Parkway), at Meadowhall Interchange (M1, junction 34) and Middlewood.
